We need to raise money to pay for food and drink and I hope my friends at school could support me. If we raise enough we might be able to get everyone a gift too.

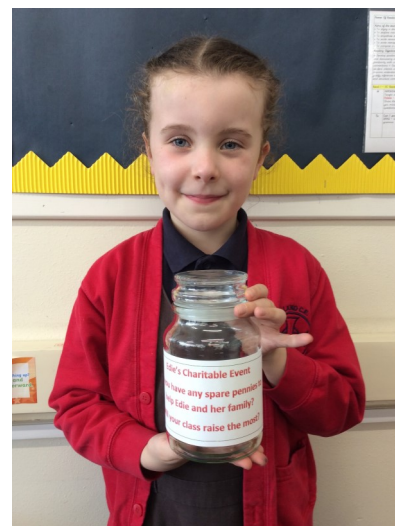
To start our fundraising each class will be getting a Jar, and we hope you all bring in some pennies to put in your class Jar.
