Health Update

If your child has symptoms of COVID-19, please keep your child at home and contact school to advise us of any absence.

Public Health latest advice:

Anyone who tests positive for COVID-19 should stay at home for at least 5 and up to 10 days and avoid contact with other people.

Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 may choose to take a lateral flow test from 5 days after symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another lateral flow test the next day.

If <u>both these test results are negative</u>, and the person **does not have a high temperature**, they can safely return to the setting before the end of the full, advised 10-day period.
