Crime Scene Investigations in EYFS

Following on from our student's interests, we arranged for the police to come into school and work with our children. Our two robbers Hefty Hugh and Lanky Len stole our fine prized cow. We had a crime scene set up for the children to investigate and explore. The police told us how to carefully collect evidence and gather information to help arrest the robbers. The police also demonstrated how they use their equipment and when it might be necessary. We collectively talked about theft and how it is a criminal act. The children also learnt the importance of telling the truth and not taking things that do not belong to them.

The children were able to share their thoughts around theft in a safe environment. Following on from this activity the children then helped create wanted posters to share around the community. With the help from our two officers, they patrolled our school looking for further clues.

The children had a phone call from the police officers asking for back up! When we arrived outside, we found the two robbers and placed them under arrest. We helped to put the robbers in the back of the police van!

Creative Healthy Holidays


