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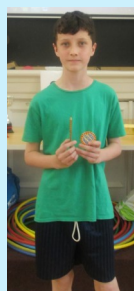

<p>We had lots of entries for our Mascot Competition for each of our houses. A huge thank you to David and Cath, from Oliver's Fish and Chips in Elland, who kindly came into assembly to announce the results. Here are the four winners that designed a mascot to represent their house colour. Well done to everyone who entered and huge congratulations to the winners.</p> 	<p>We have recently had several cases of head lice. Please could you check your child's hair. Below is the recommended treatment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Dampen the hair thoroughly and apply a small amount of oil or conditioner. 2. Make sure there is good lighting. 3. Comb the hair with an ordinary comb. 4. Using a special detection comb. 5. Begin at the top of the head, making sure that the comb is touching the scalp, comb slowly towards the end of the hair then clean off the comb with a clean white tissue and inspect for lice. 6. Check the teeth of the comb carefully. Repeat steps 4&5, working your way around the head. <p>Please check your child's hair regularly.</p>

Covid-19 Health Update	
<p>A reminder of the national guidance currently in place (which remains unchanged from April). This is as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • COVID-19 testing (either routine or symptomatic) is no longer indicated except in very particular situations (hospitals etc). There is no access to free testing for most people. • Anyone who does test positive with a lateral flow test-should stay at home for 5 days (adults) or 3 days (children) • Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can return to the setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they feel well enough. • Children and young people with mild symptoms of respiratory infection, such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend school. 	<div style="border: 2px solid blue; border-radius: 50%; padding: 20px; text-align: center;"> <p>Symptoms</p> <p>High temperature New continuous cough Loss or change to sense of taste or smell</p> </div>
